Book Review: R2 Designs on Teneriffe

The newest gourd book has just been released by sisters Diane Richins and Shelley Fletcher of Arizona. They had the first copies hot off of the press at the Wuertz Festival. This is the first book I've seen that has instructions for doing teneriffe weaving on gourds, and the book has over 115 full color pictures of examples, step by step instructions, materials, recommended products and sources. It's written in a casual, easy to read style, but the instruction are clear and the accompanying photos make the dierctions easy to follow. The material progresses from basic weaving stiches to more complicated ones. There are a lot of examples to look at, but the book does not include specific patterns to follow. Once you learn the different kinds of stitches, you'll be able to experiment and come up with your own designs.

Book Review: Woodburning with Style

Woodburning with Style by Simon Easton is a very nice resource for beginning woodburners. It does not deal specifically with gourds, but the information provided in the well laid out chapters may be applied to any kind of burning surface. The author begins with very basic information about woodburning systems, materials that may be burned, maintenance and pen types. From there, he delves into practice exercises for different burning techniques. Some chapters deal with creating designs, transferring patterns and finishing with borders and decorative touches. The final chapters have ideas for using color with burning, lettering and even laying out Celtic designs. If you are looking for patterns - this is not the book for you. However, if you are looking for thorough and

Large canteen gourd with antlers, turkey, macaw and pheasant feathers, turquoise, horsehair, leather, shell.


